



# ADDRESS BY THE DIOCESAN BISHOP, THE RT. REV. STEPHEN KWAKU OWUSU TO THE 16<sup>TH</sup> BIENNIAL DELEGATES' CONFERENCE AND 48<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF GHAMECC - KUMASI DIOCESE



t is a great honour to write this Goodwill message to the Kumasi Diocese of the Association of Methodist Church Choirs, Ghana. I extend warm greetings from the Executives of the Diocese to the entire membership of the Church Choir. Indeed, you have been our support in the Ministry of the Church. Over the years, you have played your role dutifully and we have been blessed by your soul- inspiring music.

I want to commend the leadership of the Choir especially for the renewed interest in evangelism. I am particular excited about your evangelism programme "The Robe Must Go to Town" which has received extensive recognitions. The programme and its attendant activities has not only strengthened the choir but has awakened the need for other organizations and even the Clergy to put a spring in their evangelism drive. I have been reliably informed that other Dioceses are following suite. Ayekoo! I have always maintained and just as I discussed with you during the Encounter with the Bishop series at Bethel, Kwadaso, I challenge the Choir to take over the Church. 
Let me touch a bit on your theme "Discipleship: Living the Transformed Life in Jesus Christ". I believe to place this theme in proper perspective I would like to ask if you feel transformed after wearing this robe for quite sometime now. Transformed life in Jesus Christ reveals results. A transformed Chorister will not only sing beautifully but would apply the Words (libretto) of the tunes in practical Christian living.

You cannot be transformed when you champion LGBTQ and the likes. You cannot be transformed when hatred, enviness, backbiting, whoremongering, adultery, pornography, occultism, lateness and poor attitude to robing is your lifestyle. Remember in Romans 12: 2, Paul stated "Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may discern what is good, pleasing, and perfect will of God. My dear

choristers, allow the Word to richly dwell in you and be led by the Holy Spirit. Above all, show love to one another.

I would like to reiterate my utmost message for you during your 16<sup>th</sup> Biennial and 48<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and that is to see the choir take over in every facets of church activities; in worship, in evangelism, committing financial resources, taking leadership positions, in discipleship and in transformation. More often than not, the Choir through music have been preaching the Gospel but their lifestyles are very parallel to what they preach through singing. We should be "healthy signposts".

In conclusion, always remember that the "family of God is the Choir, and God is their audience" (Keith Getty) and this should inspire us to enrich our ministry so that God can enjoy our voices. We are also involving all professions in the Diocese for volunteered construction activities in completion of initiated projects. Let us all contribute to this worthy course to grow our Church.

To achieve these and more to be tabled, I beg for your continued support in prayer, in resources (human and financial) and your participation.


I also want to bring to your attention the tenure of elected lay offices in our Church according to the Church's calendar; beginning  $1^{st}$  October and ending  $30^{th}$  September. This must be applicable to all levels, from Society to Connexion. Elected officers must beginning their terms on  $1^{st}$  October and end on  $30^{th}$  September with a three-year tenure.



We feel and realised that;


- Wounded Spirit, are make whole.



The Association has celebrated its 49<sup>th</sup> year of its existence. This was the wake up call towards preparations for our Golden Jubilee in 2024. It was delightful to see the attendance of The Presiding Bishop, Lay President, Northern Accra Diocesan Bishop, Past Diocesan Bishops, a host of Superintendent Ministers, Circuit Chaplains, National, Diocesan, Circuit, Society Patrons and well-wishers across the connexion. However, preparations are far advanced to replicate the same program in the Northern zone, to be held at Kumasi. I therefore encourage officers at all levels, as well as all cherished choristers to continue to work hard as a team for the celebration. COME!!! Hold hands with me, as we prepare towards our beautiful 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Milestone celebration. As your leader, I can only promise you of a wonderful time come next year.

#### DISCIPLINE

Brothers and sisters, Service! The watch word and hallmark of every good choir and a chorister is disciplineThe bible says in Romans 12:2that "...do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what is the good, and acceptable, and perfect will of God…". Also, Paul's letter to the church of Corinth in 2Corinthians 5:17 says "...therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old things have passed away; behold the new has come…". May I admonish you to do things right in the sight of God. Let's not copy what is not good and are being practiced elsewhere, but the good and acceptable ones. We are well aware that some Circuit and Diocesan officers at the societies are the worst offenders on discipline and hence compromise and look on for others to do same. However, I still have a few words for members who are yet to refrain from those unattractive behaviours which does not speak well of them as Choristers and as Christians. Let us throw away our old things and do the perfect will of God.

#### **ACCOUNTABILITY ISSUES**

It has become a constitutional convention, directing all dioceses to streamline all financial transaction issues within the diocesan organization as well as the various Diocesan Lay Councils. Kindly step up your level of controls. Please, prepare to send your books for proper auditing. When we do this everyone, including our own members, would be encouraged to contribute to our finances.

#### FINANCES

Brethren, we praise the Lord for the revival of the Association to this level. In the last Audit report received from the headquarters, the Church hierarchy lauded the Choir for adopting and putting up prudent and judicious use of funds. Indeed, we are working hard. We pray that these practices would be replicated at all levels. A lot of Dioceses owe substantially at the Connexional level. What are you doing about it? We encourage you to organize programs and activities which would build and unite the choir on one hand and mobilize funds for its sustainability on the other hand. Let us make conscious efforts to pay up our debts to keep the Association running. It is my ardent hope that after this conference you will pay up all your debts owed the Connexion.

#### CONCLUSION

Chairman, Rt. Rev. Bishop, Lay Chairman, Ministers of the Gospel, distinguished invited guests, fellow choristers; let me use this opportunity to express our profound gratitude to the Church hierarchy, Patrons at all levels, Connexional Council Members, and to all choristers for their support and encouragement over the years. ## DIOCESAN CHAIRMAN'S ADDRESS TO 16<sup>TH</sup> BIENNIAL DELEGATES' CONFERENCE AND 48<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY

#### 1.0 Salutations and Overview

The Distinguished Bishop of Kumasi Diocese, The Rt Rev. Stephen Kwaku Owusu, our Eminent Lay Movement Chairman, Dr. Christopher Larbie, the Efficient Synod Secretary, Very Rev. Samson Obeng Adjei, our Adorable Chaplain, Very Rev. Charles K. Sangmoah, All Reverend Ministers present, Our Ever ready Diocesan Council of Patrons, our resolute Connexional Chairman, Bro. Paul Laryea and our able Connexional Executives, our cherished Chairperson and Invited Guests for the day and finally, the people called Choristers of GHAMECC, SERVICE!!.

It is indeed a great honour to address this beautiful gathering as the Chairman of one of the best Dioceses in the Connexion. I am particularly delighted that I address this gathering during the road to the Connexional 50years of existence. Rt. Bishop, I believe it would be proper to centre this address on the strategic plan of the GHAMECC Kumasi Diocese which lies in the overall strategic plan of our Church dubbed "**Agenda for Transformation, Revival and Growth**". In this order, we will be able to assess our performance and identify the gaps to work at. Rt. Bishop, the Diocese approved a 5-action of a three-year strategic plan; they are Evangelism, Leadership Training and Development of Musicianship, Social Responsibility, Membership Drive (Growth) and Finances.

## 2.0 STRATEGIC PLAN ONE - EVANGELISM

#### 2.1 The Robe Must Go to Town

Rt. Bishop, Jesus Christ before leaving this earth gave us a task to go and preach the Gospel in all lands. Since we took office in November 2022, we believed it was time for the Church Choir to take the Gospel to those outside the church and to interact with them in a music-filled and spoken word atmosphere. We thus developed the concept **"The Robe Must Go to Town"**. This activity pushed us to come out of the stalls in the churches to the corners of the streets, preaching the Gospel and providing music for the soul. We have had three of these outreaches at the Diocesan level and though we cannot measure the souls won, we are confident that seeds sown have germinated. Yesterday, we had a spirit-filled time at Tech Junction. God bless us all for coming. Other Circuits including Asuoyeboa, Offinso, Jachie, Atonsu Agogo and Abuakwa have taken to the streets to spread the Gospel too. We are receiving signals of collaborations from radio stations and other institutions who want to join us in this evangelism drive and we welcome all to make this evangelism go beyond our dream. The Scripture Union of Ghana has been remarkable in this drive. They provide us with the tracts free of charge. Take a guess where we will be going on our 4<sup>th</sup> drive? The brothels...Yes, the brothels, the Ghettos. We will take the

Gospel to the hardest of places. We are very grateful to Very Rev. Dr. Solomon Bruce and Very Rev. Nancy Broni-Appiah.

#### 2.2 Dwene Ho Bio

We continue our evangelism drive by leveraging on technology to learn the word of God. *Dwene Ho Bio* is a daily guide to understanding a chapter or 10-20 verses in the Bible. We believe each day that we must connect to our God through the understanding of His Word. So far, *Dwene Ho Bio* has covered **the Gospel According to Matthew, the Book of Ezra, the Book of Nehemiah, the Gospel according to Mark, the Book of Ruth, The Epistle according to Jude and the Book of Esther** (at the time of sending document to the press). It's been awesome and inspiring that we receive testimonies on how it is reshaping the morning devotion of many Christians. One sure fact about this daily devotion is that, the writer of the devotion is expanding his knowledge of the word of God whilst searching through scriptures and this we also believe that the reader is also learning much and living like Jesus Christ. We hope that within the 3years of our strategic plan, we shall be able to study the whole Bible and come to a great understanding of scriptures.

#### 2.3 Hymns of Our Faith

Rt. Bishop, my administration took over from an organized one led by the Distinguished Bro. Kweku Ahinful Gaisie (Chairman), Bro Kofi Aikins (Secretary) and Bro. Michael Paakwesi Ampomah (Music Director) and their officers. They believed in the spreading of the gospel through inspiring hymns and therefore gathered choristers in the Diocese to sing some hymns of faith. The programme dubbed "Hymns of our Faith" filming and recording took place at the Ebenezer Methodist Church, Bantama on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> April 2022. So, we inherited this programme and worked on it by putting them on pen drives. There are both audio and video versions on the pen drive. It is inspiring and refreshing listening to and yes, it really makes our faith in Christ more grounded. We launched it on 5<sup>th</sup> March 2023 at Old Tafo Wesley Society. Since then, we have distributed widely for many to grab copies including transport stations so that it could be listened to by passengers who will be travelling. We are hopeful that whilst at this conference, soul inspiring music/hymns are urging and speaking to souls on commercial transport vehicles travelling. We still have copies available at our Conference desks here. Kindly grab a copy.

#### 2.4 Prayer Tower

Rt. Bishop, Invited Guests, in every organization there are some unseen heroes who usually are not appreciated simply because the outputs of their actions are not physically seen. One of such people or groups within our workforce is the Prayer Tower. Immediately after our induction, it became expedient that we intensify our prayer life and network. Together with the Diocesan Evangelist, Bro. Samuel Akwasi Yeboah, we agreed to have a Prayer Tower to pray fervently into our activities. They have been zealous and remained an absolute force for our administration. The Tower meets at Bantama Saturday mornings for prayers. I appreciate this team and I pause for us to applaud them. We encourage more to join.

# 3.0 STRATEGIC PLAN TWO – LEADERSHIP TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

#### 3.1 Organ/Song Teaching Workshop

One of the challenges of the Diocese is the lack of choirmasters and organists for some societies. This lack of choirmasters and organists more often than not seems to be a challenge at out-metro or distressed societies in some metro societies. For many, the best has been a band player. To address this gap, we inherited an Organ Clinic that trains organists for the church. However, this clinic was also 'sick' because the students or the societies who were supposed to pay just 50cedis a month could not do so as well as the shift system on the part of the learners. Again, the out-metro societies couldn't access this training; as such it became expedient to have an alternative plan. Significantly, there was the need for local content. We believe that if we are able to train someone who resides in the community will be much better than a visitor in terms of offering continual service. We therefore stressed on local content, thus, training someone who lives in that community.

In December 2022, we tried a one-week training and societies were engaged to bring people for training. We provided free training materials and accommodation and supported with feeding of the participants. Accommodation was provided at the Independence Hall, KNUST at no cost to the learner. In all, 54 participants attended the workshop. We do follow-ups online and hopefully will have an in-person training again in December this year.

## 3.2 Visit to Out Metro Choirs

Rt. Bishop and Invited Guests, there is significantly a lot of work to be done at the out-metro societies. You need to visit them in order to gravitate towards appreciating their challenges. Word of mouth presentation can never give you a true picture. Since we took over in November 2022, we have made 10 visitations to some of these distressed choirs. An observed challenge as mentioned above is lack of choirmasters, organists, funds and personnel to hold key positions. The need to strengthen leadership and have organists and choirmasters becomes imperative. We hope that local content can do the trick by training someone who resides in the town other than sending someone over to help. There is more to be done by this administration to provide more leadership skills to our beloved choristers who are doing a great job of holding together these choirs. It is a small start, just a start. We hope to fill in the gaps and present a more satisfactory report on this next year.

#### 3.3 The Diocesan Choir

The pride of the Diocese has been the inspiring Diocesan Choir led by the virtuoso Directors (Bro. Evans Appiah-Kubi, Bro. Michael Oppong and Sis. Segua Adjepong). The Diocesan

Choir made history by becoming the first Diocesan Choir to perform the Oratorio "Creation" by Joseph Haydn on 9<sup>th</sup> April 2023 at the Ebenezer Methodist Church, Bantama. It was an unforgettable evening when we were dazzled by the awesome talents we possess. Our choir made us pitch tent in heaven. We shook hands with our Creator. The Kumasi Diocesan Choir is in a galaxy of their own. The Choir also participated in the "Connexional Festival of Praise" at Calvary Methodist Church, Amakom and the "GHAMECC @ 50 Northern Sector Launch". If it is the Kumasi Diocesan Choir then it is a SPIRIT-FILLED performance. We are absolutely proud of you.

## 4.0 STRATEGIC PLAN THREE – SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY 4.1 Welfare System

Under the leadership of Bro. S.O Tenkorang (Past Chairman of the Diocese), a welfare scheme was created. The welfare system was a simple no contribution no benefit scheme. Members were to contribute through their circuit coordinators into the Fund. So far, we have had very few contributors to the Welfare Scheme and as at 30<sup>th</sup> May 2023, we have GHS 2468.14 as cash at bank (Multi Credit), GHS 635.00 as cash on hand and an investment of GHS 68,000.00. The total amount is thus **GHS 71,103.14**. (A full financial report is published in this dossier by the trustees of the scheme).

After the Covid pandemic, the contribution has been dead slow and we need to deliberate on the mode of contribution and benefits. A significant number of the contributors have benefitted from the scheme which covers wedding, demise of spouses, disasters, and sickness. How do we raise interest in members in contributing to the scheme? Can we look at the benefits? These and many other concerns need to be thoroughly discussed at this conference. I want to thank Bro. Alexander Dwomoh Agyemang, Bro. James Owusu and Bro. Michael Otchere Aboagye who have acted as Trustees to the scheme. They have well protected our Fund and we are grateful to them.

## 4.2 Excellence Fund

Rt. Bishop, education is very key to the development of the Choir. When the members are educated, growth is assured. We have witnessed the untimely death of some choristers who were the breadwinners of their families. What happens to the education of the children of our departed choristers? We hear of the struggles some choristers go through in their education or in paying the fees of their children. How can we help? We are aware some do have the funds but the connection to get to their dream choices always become a challenge. This is why the GHAMECC Kumasi Diocesan Excellence Fund is created. As part of our Social Responsibility activities, we want to show love and support to those in distress especially those yearning for education and apprenticeship.

Rt. Bishop, the Excellence Fund will be launched today during the Official Opening of the 16<sup>th</sup>

Biennial and 48<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. To sustain the Fund, we shall contribute a percentage of the proceeds of our programme into the Fund. We shall also look out for agencies to contribute to the Fund. Beneficiaries from the Fund shall receive their stipend during the annual Rededication Service which is mostly held in January. We call on everyone to help us establish a strong Excellence Fund towards a brighter future. In my own small way and support from friends, we start this Excellence Fund with an amount of 12,000 Ghana cedis. We need more to willingly donate to this Fund. God bless you for donating to the Fund

### 5.0 STRATEGIC PLAN FOUR -MEMBERSHIP DRIVE & VISIBILITY 5.1 Junior Choir

Rt. Bishop, we have made efforts towards increasing the membership of the Association. Membership can only be increased if we make the Choir attractive to others. People join organizations because they perceive satisfaction. One sure way of membership drive is through our Junior Choir. They are our future. Our Music Directors, the Junior Choir Coordinator, Bro. Eric Owusu ably supported by the Connexional Coordinator Bro. Joshua Okyere Twum have coordinated the activities very well. We have supported the Junior Choir towards growth by urging them to do more for Christ. One key programme has been our Alders gate Week Celebration were our Hymns of Faith are performed by these Junior Choirs. We see development in voices. We also inaugurated a Junior Choir at Trede Society in the Santasi Circuit on 11<sup>th</sup> June 2023 and in September we shall inaugurate one in the Ayeduase Circuit. That would take us to 20 Junior Choirs in the Diocese. We also bought into the Connexional plan of graduating these Junior choristers who are 18years and above into the main Church Choir.

At our Diocesan Executive Meetings, we agreed that at least every circuit head must have a Junior Choir by 2024. Letters have been written to the Superintendent Ministers to kindly ensure that the Choirmasters are able to comply. This is one sure way of increasing our membership drive. Come October next month, our Junior Choir Conference will be hosted by Abuakwa Circuit. It is a residential Conference and the choirs are getting ready for a spirit-filled encounter. We have also designed recreational activities to bring fun and foster unity amongst them.

## 5.2 Church Choir Inauguration

Our membership drive for the Church Choir lies in our various activities largely in the Societies and the Circuits. If a Church Choir does not organize Musical Concerts, Evangelical Programmes, etc, there is no way it will attract new members. Our membership drive can only be sustained when we are active in the church and outside the church. We have made extensive visits to Out-Metro circuits and have discussed at length how to raise choirs in the various societies. We have realized that where there is a choirmaster to teach songs and an organist to play, the choir thrives, otherwise, they struggle and it collapses. In sum, our membership drive is tied to the training of more musicians especially Choirmasters and organists. Since we took off in November, we have inaugurated a choir at Emmanuel Society Nwamase in the Nsima Circuit.

#### 5.3 Website Launching and Media Team

Rt. Bishop, although technology abounds we have not done well in leveraging technology in keeping statistics and data of our Association. Information flow has not been that perfect. Most times, information from the Connexional or the diocese does not trickle down to the society level as desired. Again, the communities in which we find ourselves are not preview to what we do in and outside the Church.

Rt. Bishop, we have designed and created our own website which has pages of information about our Association and the various activities we carry out. Today, after my address, the Bishop of the Diocese supported by the Lay Chairman, the Synod Secretary, Our Chaplain and Connexional Executives will launch the website. There is an add-on to this website that enables us to keep record of every chorister. I urge all choristers to go online to register. It takes only 3minutes to get it done. I beseech every choirmaster to ensure that every chorister is registered. I want to appreciate and commend the chorister, Bro. Ebo Ocran (Ayigya Circuit) who sponsored the designing of the website. The Secretariat of the Diocese shall manage and update the website accordingly.

With regards to raising a Media Team, we first and foremost need to get the gadgets to facilitate their work. We shall need a DSLR Canon 5D Mark III Camera, a Laptop (a Workstation preferably), Stands and a Drone. This would augment our media work and help promote evangelism. We need support in this regard.

#### 5.4 History and Archives

Rt. Bishop, we still have some of the founding members of the Association with us here in the Kumasi Diocese. Bro. Awotwi Boison, Bro. IK Oboh, Bro. Paul Ofosuhene among others are choristers who played a great deal of role in the early 1970s to form the then Choir Union. It is sad to say that, it is difficult to have records of most of these founding members. Some of these founding members are Bros. K.O Bedu-Addo (Chairman), J.P Quaigraine (Vice Chairman), Sam A. Boison (Secretary), I.K Oboh (Assistant Secretary), D.F Ndzeh (Choirmaster/Organist), I.K Boison (Financial Secretary) and Sis. Virginia Turkson (Treasurer). History makes us understand the detailed picture of where we stand today. The toil of our predecessors motivates many to march on. In this light, we gathered these founding members and documented the history of the Association. This took place on 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2023 at Wesley Cathedral, Adum. A copy of this recording will be uploaded on the website. Though most were well advanced in age and difficult to give exact dates, we believe that it is a good beginning in putting our history intact for future references. We are grateful to Bro. Donald Osei-Akoto and team for a good job.

#### 6.0 STRATEGIC PLAN FIVE - FINANCES & PROJECTS

Rt. Bishop, our finances and projects have been fairly satisfactory. We run on at least adequate financial balances. We try to cut our expenses according to our budget. To the Glory of God, we do not owe and completed payment of 2023 Connexional Assessment in the second month of the year. A significant amount of our finances come from Assessment and fundraising activities during calendar programmes. We are looking at creating a business hub that can sustain our expenditure. The Transport Business of obtaining a bus was ideal however, the proposal of creating a new diocese out of the Kumasi Diocese killed the thought. Perhaps, when we are fully separated, then we can work on this bus project.

We are looking at creating other projects to rake in money to support choir work. The selling of Hymns of our Faith pen drives also provides a bit of income. There is more to do under this action call.

## 7.0 OTHER NEWS

#### 7.1 Kumasi North Diocese

The Diocesan Officers Committee embraced the creation and introduction of the Kumasi North Diocese starting 1<sup>st</sup> October 2024. We complied with all the directives from the Bishop's Office and Lay Movement Council and elected new executive officers for the proposed Kumasi North Diocese on 21<sup>st</sup> January 2023 at Ebenezer Methodist Church, Bantama.

I cannot complete this address without appreciating the unflinching support from our patrons. They have been everywhere with us. Let us give them huge applauds. We are hoping to add on to the number of our patrons. Through this address, I humbly appeal to the people called Methodists to consider being patrons of the Diocesan Association. The blessings are huge.

## 7.3 Some Connexional Concerns

Distinguished Guest gathered here, as chairman I receive a lot of concerns from fellow choristers. Some I am able to solve right away on the phone. Some I have to consult my officers and elders and some I have to push to my Boss at the Connexional Level. #### 3.0 MEMBERSHIP:

Kumasi Diocese has One hundred and fifty – six (156) inaugurated society choirs from forty (40) Circuit Choirs.

The total membership of the Diocese stands at Three thousand, two hundred and seventyeight (3,278) choristers, consisting one thousand, one hundred and forty-two (1,142) males representing 35.0% and two thousand, one hundred and thirty-six (2,136) females representing 65.0%. There are also 18 Junior Choirs within the Diocese. The details are indicated in Table1.

There is a slight increase in membership of 74 choristers. We could attribute this to our effort in membership drive and evangelistic activities. Significantly, though most circuits had acceptable variances, there are some circuits that have had significant decline in membership. Ayigya (-79), Suame (-41), Ahinsan (-41), Abuakwa (-12) all in the metro circuits had significant decline in membership.



#### 4.0 **PROGRAMMES & ACTIVITIES**

## 4.1 CHURCH & LAY MOVEMENT ACTIVITIES

- 4.1.1 The Diocesan Secretariat was represented at the Induction Service of the five (5) Diocesan Lay Chairmen including Kumasi Lay Chairman at Wesley Cathedral Methodist Church, Adum Kumasi on Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> October, 2022.
- 4.1.2 The Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer participated in a One-Day Seminar on the Church's Strategic Plan for the next five (5) years. We were also trained on sustaining effective leadership and raising funds for church's activities. The training took place on 12<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 at Wharton Chapel, Mbrom.
- 4.1.3 The Diocesan Secretariat, represented the Association in all Lay Movement Executive Council Meetings during the period under review. Circuit reports to Diocesan Secretariat are also indicative of active role of choristers in Society and Circuit Lay Movement activities.

## 4.1.4 2023 Lay Movement Council Week Celebration

The 2023 "Lay Movement Week" was launched on Sunday, 12th March, 2023, at all societies on the Theme: Discipleship: Living the Transformed Life in Jesus Christ. The Circuits and Societies were tasked to organise the Week-Long programmes from Monday 13<sup>th</sup> March 2023 to Sunday, 19<sup>th</sup> March, 2023. Activities included revivals, health talks and singing and quiz competitions amongst organizations. Reports showed successful activities across the Diocese

## 4.1.5 Annual Synod

The Association was represented at the 2022 & 2023 Diocesan Annual Synods hosted by Kumasi Circuit at Wesley Cathedral, Adum and Ahensan Circuit at Mount Zion respectively. The Diocesan Choir, Officers and the respective circuits' choirs featured wonderfully at the Official Opening and the Thanksgiving. The Rt. Rev. Stephen Kwaku Owusu (Diocesan Bishop) in his keynote address highly commended the Association for their sustained interest in evangelism especially "The Robe Must Go to Town". He urged us to continue to preach the Gospel.

## 4.2 CONNEXIONAL INVOLVEMENT

## 4.2.1 Connexional Council Meetings (C. C. M.)

The Diocese was fully represented at all Connexional Council Meetings formerly, National Executive Committee (N.E.C) held during the period and submitted reports on all activities accordingly.

#### 4.2.2 Connexional Zonal Music Festival

The Kumasi Diocesan Association hosted the maiden Connexional Zonal Music Festival of Zone E on Saturday, 15<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 at Calvary Methodist Church, Amakom. The Rt. Rev. Aduse Poku (Supt. Kwadaso Circuit) represented the Diocesan Boshop, the Choir Chaplain (Very Rev. Sangmoah) and Ministers in Amakom Circuit graced the occasion as well as our Patrons, the Connexional 1<sup>st</sup> Deputy Director of Music and the Connexional Secretary. Our Diocesan Choir, the Obuasi Diocesan Choir and the Effiduasi Diocesan Choir performed beautifully. The objective of this music festival was to awaken some of the diocesan choirs that had gone into hibernation after the covid pandemic. At the Connexional meeting in November 2022, Kumasi Diocese was commended for a good organization.

#### 4.2.3 Re-Dedication Service

During the period under review, the Diocesan Association held her annual Re-Dedication Service to renew our commitment to the work of God as choral evangelists.

The 2023 Re-Dedication Service was held on Saturday, 14<sup>th</sup> January, 2023 at the Wesley Cathedral, Adum on the theme "*Discipleship: Living the Transformed Life in Jesus Christ*" Romans 12:1 – 2. The Rt. Rev. Stephen Kwaku Owusu, the Diocesan Bishop of Kumasi delivered the sermon and Very Rev. Charles Kojo Sangmoah, the Diocesan Choir Chaplain led the service. Very Rev. Nancy Broni Appiah, Rev. James Annan and other Kumasi Circuit Ministers were also present to support the programme.

#### 4.2.4 Connexional Music Workshop

The Kumasi Diocesan Association hosted the Connexional Music Directorate on Friday, 17<sup>th</sup> March, 2023, for the first workshop of the year at Calvary Methodist Church, Amakom. Our Diocesan Directors fully participated in the workshop. The workshop discussed among other things peer adjudication, Revising our Methodist Praise and how to development professional musicianship. These discussions have been very helpful and have shaped our singing and singing competitions.

## 4.3 DIOCESAN ACTIVITIES/ PROGRAMMES

#### 4.3.1 Meetings

#### 1. Officers' Meetings

Series of Officers' Meetings including emergency ones were held. The emergency meetings were mainly on handing over procedures, the Diocesan Conference, Connexional Calls and its attendant issues. The regular ones focused on developing ideas for sustainable development of the Association and following our strategic plans news. These meetings were mostly held on Wednesdays between 4:30pm – 9:00pm at Ebenezer Methodist Church, Bantama.

#### 2. Diocesan Executive Committee (DEC) Meetings.

Similarly, we had series of Diocesan Executive Committee (D.E.C) Meetings and this includes emergency ones as well at Wesley Cathedral, Adum – Kumasi to evaluate and discuss issues from Connexional, Diocese, Circuits, Society and the church as a whole. At such meetings, reports from Diocesan Secretariat, Music Directorate and Financial Reports are discussed passionately.

### 4.3.2 Diocesan Mid-Year Praise (Music Festival)

The Diocese was zoned into three (3) for mid – year praise music festival. The first was zone A held at Emmanuel Methodist Church, Abuakwa on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> June, 2022, the second was zone B at Dunwell Methodist Church, Dichemso on 3<sup>rd</sup> July, 2022. The third was Zone C at Bethel Methodist Church, Ayigya on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> July, 2022 and Zone A which is the last zone had theirs on Sunday. The circuits' performance was very encouraging.

## 4.3.3 Diocesan Mini-Conference

A Mini-Conference was organized at Ebenezer Methodist Church, Pankrono on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> August 2023 and a Thanksgiving Service on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> August, 2022. Some of the major activities observed during the conference were: official opening of conference, election of officers to steer the affairs of the Diocesan Association and Music workshop. Electoral College was constituted supervised by the Lay Ministry and Connexional Officers (Chairman and Secretary) and the following choristers were elected as Diocesan Officers for 3year tenure of office:

#### 4.3.5 Other Programmes

The programme was held at Ebenezer Methodist Church, Pankrono on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> September, 2022.

#### 2. Induction Service

The elected Diocesan Officers were inducted into office at the Christ The King Methodist Church, Asokwa in the Amakom Circuit on 13<sup>th</sup> November, 2022.

The service was officiated by the Kumasi Diocesan Bishop, Rt. Rev. Stephen Kwaku Owusu and Diocesan Lay Chairman, Bro. Dr. Christopher Larbie, assisted by the Connexional Secretary, Sister Lena Manson, Connexional 1<sup>st</sup> Deputy Director of Music, Bro. Isaac Acquay and Connexional Junior Choirs Co-ordinator, Bro. Joshua Okyere Twum. The Chaplain who was engaged with another responsibility elsewhere on that day was later inducted on 11<sup>th</sup> December 2022 at Mt. Horeb Methodist Church, Ahodwo.

## 3. Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols

The 2022 GHAMECC Kumasi Diocesan Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols Service was held in the various Zones on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> December, 2022 at 5.00pm. Maakro hosted Choirs in Zone 'A', Pankrono for Zone 'B', Ahensan for Zone 'C' and Nsima for Zone 'D'. Assigned Diocesan Officers were present at the various zones to join in the yuletide celebrations and also moderate the activities. The readings were shared amongst the various circuit officers and the host circuit chaplain gave the Christmas message. Attendance was good on the part of choristers across the various zones and the performance was seasonal with appropriate libretto and tunes. We need to work on improving the attendance of the congregation. More often than not, it is all choristers' affair.

A week after,18<sup>th</sup> December 2022, the Diocesan Choir featured in the Connexional/Diocesan Carol Service hosted by Wesley Cathedral, Adum. This was a morning service and was captured and shown on WTv.

## 4. Junior Choir Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols

The Junior Choirs had their Festival of Nine Lessons and Carol Service on Saturday, 17<sup>th</sup> December, 2022 at Calvary Methodist Church, Atimatim. All the 18 Junior Choirs performed very well to the admiration of the invited guests. Mostly at the organ were teenagers however the conducting roles were done by adults. This is something we need to encourage and also get these teenagers and young ones to take up teaching songs and conducting roles.

## 5. Hosting the Northern Accra Diocesan Choir

The Kumasi Diocesan Choir Association hosted the Northern Accra Diocesan Choir Association from Friday, 3<sup>rd</sup> March to Monday, 6<sup>th</sup> March, 2023. Activities held during the visit were our Evangelism programme "The Robe Must Go To Town" at Kejetia, visit to the Manhyia Museum, Festival of Praise at Bethel Society, Kwadaso, Sunday Divine Service at Wesley Cathedral, Adum, Launching of Hymns of Our Faith at Wesley, Tafo and Conviviality: Cooking and Fun Games at the Wesley College of Education.

#### 6. **'Hymns of Our Faith' Launch**

As part of the programme lined-up for the year, the Diocese were able to launch an album dubbed "Hymns of our Faith" at Wesley Methodist Chapel, Tafo in the Old Tafo Circuit on the 5<sup>th</sup> March, 2023. The album has both video and MP3 versions of our cherished hymns. Majority of the hymns were in the Akan language. It was a mass rendition of hymns by choristers within the Diocese.

#### 7. Diocesan Choir performs 'Creation' by Joseph Haydn

Kumasi Diocesan Choir staged a programme dubbed "**Creation (Oratorio by J. Haydn)**" concert by which no Diocesan Choir in the Connexion have been able to perform. The Diocesan Choir performed the entire Creation (Oratorio) on the Easter Sunday, 9<sup>th</sup> April, 2023 at Ebenezer Methodist Church, Bantama.

#### 4.4 Evangelism & Outreach Activities:

The Kumasi GHAMECC has embarked on two massive evangelism and outreach programmes. Namely

**4.4.1 Online Evangelism:** this is done at the last Saturday of every month where a poster is designed and choristers in the diocese are encouraged to share these flyers on their social handles (Whatsapp, Instagram, Facebook, Telegram, etc)

We also shared devotional messages to help Christians to reflect on Jesus during the Lenten period. We share daily devotion messages dubbed **"DWENE HO BIO"** to uplift the spiritual well-being of the choristers and fellow Christians.

#### 4.4.2 The Robe Must Go to Town:

Choristers in the Diocese met at the Regional Headquarters of Ghana Post premises to use singing of hymns and Word of God to evangelize to the public on 24<sup>th</sup> December, 2022. This maiden edition had over 250 choristers singing seasonal Christmas melodies as well as "highlifes". Tracts from Scripture Union were used to facilitate the street evangelism process. Pedestrians, sellers and buyers were seen to be enjoying the moment and dancing to the tunes. Very Rev. Solomon Bruce, Very Rev. Charles Sangmoah, Very Rev Broni and Rev. Samuel Bentum Arthur took stage to preach the word.

The second edition had over 300 choristers including Northern Accra Diocesan Choir at the Kumasi City Market, Kejetia premises to use singing of hymns and spoken Word to evangelize as well as "highlifes" to the public on 4<sup>th</sup> March, 2023. Tracts from Scripture Union were used to facilitate the street evangelism process. Traders, sellers

and buyers were seen to be enjoying the moment and dancing to the tunes. Very Rev. Sampson Obeng Adjei, the Synod Secretary, Very Rev. Solomon Bruce, Rev. James Annan, took stage to preach the word. In attendance was the Diocesan Lay Movement Vice Chairman.

#### 4.4.3 Keyboard Skills and Song Teaching Workshop

As part of the strategic plan to train more organists and choirmasters for the diocese especially those in the distressed and out-metro societies, there was a 5day intensive keyboard skills training and song teaching workshop. Participants were accommodated at Independence Hall, KNUST from 12<sup>th</sup> - 16<sup>th</sup> December 2022. Participants were practically taken through the basics of learning the keyboard and could at least identify the musical notes on the score including their corresponding counts. The participants are now being assisted virtually for their keyboard practices. This initiative will augment the Music Clinic that was earlier being run on Saturdays.

#### 4.5 Societies & Circuits

#### 4.5.1 Inauguration

The Kumasi Diocese were able to inaugurate two (2) Choirs within the period under review. Mt Olivet Church Choir (Ampayoo) in the Ahodwo Circuit on Sunday, 21<sup>st</sup> August, 2022 and Emmanuel Methodist Church Choir, Nwamase in the Nsima Circuit on Sunday,19<sup>th</sup> February, 2023 respectively. Both Services were officiated by the Superintendent Ministers Very Rev. Charles Sangmoah and Very Rev. Badu Botah, and assisted by the Diocesan Chairmen, Bro. Prof. Samuel Nortey, Bro. Kweku A. Gaisie (Immediate Past Chairman) and other Diocesan and Circuit Officers.

#### 4.5.2 Visitations

There was the need for periodic visitations to some of the Circuits in the Diocese that are distressed and facing numerous challenges. Secretariat resolved to embark on massive visitation to these circuits to open up a dialogue on the way forward. Some of the circuits visited were Brodekwano, Mankranso, Wioso, Ankaase, Tepa, Akomadan, Offinso and Kuntanase.

Series of visitations have been scheduled to cover all the distress circuits before 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2023. Also, some few Metro circuits would be visited to address some of their challenges.

#### 4.6 Fraternal Relations / Other Organisational Activities

The Diocesan Secretariat honoured all invitations received from our sister organizations and dioceses within the period.



# REPORT OF THE DIOCESAN MUSIC DIRECTORATE TO THE 16<sup>TH</sup> BIENNIAL DELEGATES' CONFERENCE AND 48<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY @ KNUST - 2023. 1<sup>ST</sup> APRIL, 2022 - 30<sup>TH</sup> APRIL 2023

### PREAMBLE

Go, labour on; 'tis not for nought, Thy earthly loss is heavenly gain: Men heed thee, love thee, praise thee not; The Master praises; what are men? (M.H.B. 589 vrs2)

### 1.0: INTRODUCTION

This report is a detailed account of the work of the Diocesan Directorate of Music from October, 2022 to August 2023. It also gives an account of the challenges identified during the period under review, the way forward and the future plans. All too soon another conference is here with us after the one-day Mini conference at Pankrono Methodist Church in August, 2022 where we were given the opportunity to come and serve our noble Association. Let us cease this opportunity to thank God for His majestic glory, guidance and strength.

### 2.1- MUSIC WORKSHOP

The Directorate attended and participated fully in all the Connexional music Workshops for all Directors and their Deputies in the period under review. The resource person was Professor Josuah Amoah (Legon). He took us through several topics, like directing choral repertoires, effective concert planning, proper accompaniment, etc.

At the diocesan level, series of workshops were held. They were centered on effective rehearsal techniques, basic adjudication skills, diocesan Performance Assessment songs, etc. The resource person was bro. Isaac Acquay ( $1^{st}$  Deputy D.O.M – Connexional). Our past directors Bro. Stephen Anderson and bro Michael Ampomah were also in attendance to support.

### NB: GHAMECC SINGING COMPETITIONS

In summary, concerning the future of singing competition at the Connexional level, it has been agreed at the Connexional Council Meeting to suspend the "peer adjudication" system and adopt "5-member panel jury". Members of the panel could

be past Connexional Directors or any competent musicians within the Association or in the church.

## 2.2 - MUSIC TRAINING (LOCAL CONTENT)

Through the help and initiative of our Diocesan Chairman Brother Professor Samuel Nortey and the entire executives, we were able to organize One-Week Intensive Residential Training on organ playing, song teaching, general musicianship at KNUST – Independence Hall from 12<sup>th</sup> – 16<sup>th</sup> December, 2022. The patronage and the entire exercise was really massive. We had over eighty (80) participants within the Diocese and some even, outside Kumasi Diocese. We are grateful to all especially, Prof Nortey, Madam Frempa, Bro. Gaisie, Very Rev Sangmoah, and brother directors' Acquay, Josuah, Ameyaw, Leonard (Bremang), Sefah (Jachie), Handle, etc. for their support.

# 2.3 - UPDATE ON THE STATE OF THE MUSIC / ORGAN CLINIC

During the year under review, we use to have five (5) centers for the music clinic; Ayigya, Bantama, Suame, Pankrono and Wesley Cathedral with over fifty (50) students. Unfortunately, almost all the centers are currently not functioning due to several factors. The major challenge was funding or financial constraints especially those who were being sponsored by the churches. We will therefore plead with brother chairman, the entire executives and members of conference to review this program at this conference and come out with a communique.

# 3.0 - DIOCESAN CHOIR UPDATE

Diocesan choir meets on Monday evenings at K.O. Mbrom (Bishop's conference hall). The numerical strength of the choir currently stands at fifty-six (56) choristers consisting of twenty-seven (27) males and twenty-nine (29) females. The breakdown is as follows: Sopranos = 18, Altos = 9, Tenors = 12 and Basses = 13. The choir is under the following visionary and competent Directors of Music; Bro. Evans Appiah-Kubi (D.O.M), Bro Michael Oppong (1<sup>st</sup> D.D.O.M), Sis. Ekua Segua Agyapong (2<sup>nd</sup> D.D.O.M), Bro. Eric Owusu (Junior choir Coordinator) Paa Kwasi Ampomah (I. P. D. O. M) and Bro. David Wilson (Principal Org.).

# 4.0 - MID-YEAR PRAISE

This programme was introduced by the Music Directorate to revive the circuit choirs (after the Covid), raise funds to support the work of the Association and most importantly thank the Almighty God for bringing us to the middle of the year. Circuit choirs were grouped into three Zones due to the size of the Diocese. The 2022 version took place at Abuakwa (26<sup>th</sup> June), New Tafo (4<sup>th</sup> June), and Ayigya (11<sup>th</sup> July) respectively. We are grateful to all the circuits for their involvement and performance.

# 5.0- CONNEXIONAL ZONAL MUSIC FESTIVAL

The directorate in collaboration with the planning committee hosted the Connexional music festival on zonal bases (zone E) at Calvary Methodist Church, Amakom on 15<sup>th</sup> October, 2022. The following Diocesan Choirs were in attendance Effiduase, Obuasi and the host Kumasi diocesan choir. Kumasi Diocesan Band, Calvary society choir and Asawase Degraft Junior choir were also guests groups on the day. Connexional Officers present were Sis. Lena Mason, Bro. Isaac Aquaey, Bro. Josuah O. Twum and other past officers.

# 6.0 - DIOCESAN CAROL SERVICE

The 2022 diocesan carol service was organized on zonal bases (4 - zones) for circuits on the 11<sup>th</sup> December, 2022. The program took place on; Zone 'A' – Maakro, Zone 'B' – Pankrono, Zone 'C' – Ahinsan, Zone 'D' – Nzima respectively. The program was not bad but we believe there is more room for improvement come 2023. The major challenges were lateness and to some extend low attendance due to the clash of program with the singing band. Officers have taken steps to ensure it does not happen again.

# 7.0 - THE ROBE MUST GO TO TOWN

The music directorate played very instrumental role in the evangelism programme 'The Robe Must Go to Town' which was organized on the  $24^{th}$  December, 2022 (Post Office – Adum) and  $4^{th}$  March, 2023 (Kejetia Market) respectively. Songs selection, stage setup, renditions, and what have you were very admirable. Though the attendance was not what we expected, we still commend those who availed themselves to be used as a vessel for evangelism.

# 8.0- LAUNCHING OF HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

The Directorate in collaboration with the planning committee saw to the Launching of our maiden mass recording which took place at Wesley Meth. – Old Tafo on 5<sup>th</sup> March, 2023. Attendance of DEC Members and choristers were not encouraging though, the programme was a success. The following circuit choirs, Old Tafo, Bremang, Pankrono, Maakro, and New Tafo were in attendance. We will commend the Northern Accra Diocesan Choir for their immense contribution and support on that day.

# 9.0 - EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Exchange program helps to foster unity among members and it serves as a platform where we can learn from each other. In view of that the Northern Accra Diocesan Choir and their executives paid a courtesy visit to Kumasi Diocese from 3<sup>rd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> March, 2023. Both choirs had a wonderful time with regards to socialization. There was *'praise concert'* to thank God and also entertain ourselves on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> March, 2023 at Bethel Methodist – Kwadaso. The following groups performed on the day were, Diocesan choirs; Kumasi and Northern Accra, Circuit choirs; Kwadaso, Bohyen, Suame, Santasi, and Nzima. The Kumasi Diocesan Singing Band were also in attendance and we are grateful to all especially Synod Secretary V.Rev Sampson O Adjei and Superintendent Minister of Kwadaso Rt. Rev. Hayford Adusie-Poku for gracing the occasion.

# 10.0- ORATORIO (CREATION)

The Oratorio journey started around November, 2021 during the previous administration led by Bro. Gaisie. The directorate met and came up with this idea to help keep the singers busy since there were no Connexional activities. The current administration led by bro. Professor Nortey charged the directorate to continue and finish the project. High sense of hard work and team spirit exhibited by the current directorate yielded the fruit of success and the dream of Oratorio (Creation) performance on the 9<sup>th</sup> April, 2023 at Ebenezer Methodist Chapel–Bantama.

**NB**: It will interest you to know that, the Kumasi diocesan choir has made a record of being the first diocesan choir to stage an oratorio concert in Ghana. The team is proud and thank God for this great achievement.

## 10.1 - **PERFORMERS (STAGE)**

- \* Coordinator: Michael Oppong.

# 11.0 - DISCIPLESHIP

As part of creating awareness to the general public on the oratorio and also evangelizing through songs, the diocesan choir took opportunity to visit Kessben TV/ FM (morning) and Angel FM (evening) respectively for the first time on  $2^{nd}$  April, 2023 to give renditions, shared the Gospel and granted interviews. We are grateful to our Diocesan Chairman, Secretary, and bro. James Owusu for accompanying the choir.

# 12.0 - PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT

The ultimate function of Assessment is to improve singing and choral abilities at the local levels. It is therefore our duty as Diocesan Directors of Music to select appropriate music for assessments that would serve some functional ends. Based on past records, availability of technical personnel, the strength of the circuits and other factors, there has been categorization of circuit choirs into three groups (i. e. A1, A2, B).

# 12.3 - MODALITIES OR GUIDELINES FOR 2023 CONFERENCE (KNUST)

- \* Performance Assessment comes off on Friday (Group A2) and Saturday (Group B & A1) during conference.
- \* Balloting shall be done at the conference hall where the Assessment shall take place after Lunch both Friday and Saturday.
- \* The number of performers on stage shall NOT be more than 30(Group *B*), 35(Group *A2*) and 40(Group *A1*) respectively, including conductors.
- \* All Circuit Directors of music MUST ensure that their singers are seated or around the premises before the specified time for the assessment.
- \* Procession shall start at a place specified by the Diocesan Directorate of Music.
- \* Intricate procession and elaborate stage formation is discouraged. (Not more than **4mins**)
- \* All Choirs shall presents their own organist or accompanist. Where a Circuit fails to bring an organist, the Diocesan Directorate shall make a standby organist available.
- \* All organist must be in *full black and white* robes likewise the performers.
- \* Accompaniment: (Hymn, Chant) ... unaccompaniment/ Intro: (Procession, Hymn: *A1- V.2, A2-V3*, Anthem) for both groups.
- \* Order of performance: Procession, Hymn, Chant/The Lord's Prayer, Anthem and Unseen
- \* After performing the compulsory songs the leader/conductor shall, select any of the unseen pieces provided for all the groups.
- \* Three (3) member panel shall be employed for the assessment in each group.
- \* Declaration if any, for all groups shall be done on Sunday during church service presentations.
- \* The use of the baton shall be optional.
- \* Circuit Directors are advised to use their own members and avoid intruders or

foreigners, or people outside Kumasi Diocese. Circuits would be penalized (withdrawn) for flouting this rule.

- \* Coordinators for the Group B may be allowed to conduct or perform with them.
- \* There shall be no recession after the performance.

## 13.0 - VISITATION

The Directorate visited almost all the Metro Circuits and some outside metro circuits within the Diocese to assist them in their preparation towards the diocesan conference, Performance Assessment, organizing workshops and adjudicating, and other functions. Administratively, we visited some circuits during their council meetings to assist and give directions in the interest of the Association. It will also interest you to know that the Diocesan Music Directorate assisted in the inauguration of Ampayoo Church choir (Ahodwo) and Nwamase Church Choir (Nzima Circuit) respectively. We are grateful to the various circuit executives and all the societies for their support.

# 14.0 – JUNIOR CHOIR

# 14.1 - CAROL SERVICE

The Junior Choir Carol Service for 2022 was organized on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> December, 2022 at Atimatim Methodist under Old Tafo circuit. About sixteen Junior Choirs attended the programme to perform a given hymn, Anthem and danceable. In attendance were Sup. Minister of Old Tafo, other Ministers, Diocesan Officers being led by the Vice Chair and some Tafo circuit officers.

# 14.2- CARETAKERS MEETING

During the period under review, several meetings and workshops were organized for Junior choir caretakers and coordinators to take them through tonic sol-fa reading, basic rudiments of music, effective rehearsal techniques, planning of activities and how to manage the Junior choir. We are grateful to the administration and all our resource persons for their support during such meetings.

# 14.3 - FUN GAMES

All work and no play...' that was why the Directorate in collaboration with the administration organized fun games for all the Junior Choirs within the Kumasi Diocese at Wesley College of Education Park on 4<sup>th</sup> August, 2022. The attendance was very massive and the choristers really enjoyed themselves to the fullest. We are grateful to officers, organizers and especially Director Michael for their involvement in making this programme a success.

#### 14.4 - REGISTRATION

The Connexional administration wanted to have a data base for our Junior Choirs. In view of this, Diocesan Junior choir coordinators were tasked to ensure this exercise is being executed. Some of the societies complied with this directive but unfortunately, other caretakers could not assist us with their data for onward transfer. We will commend Atimatim Junior choir for their quick response and encourage those who have not yet submitted to do so.

#### 14.5 - ACTIVITIES AHEAD

Arrangements are far advanced in organizing the following programmes for the Junior Choirs within the diocese to make them active and become more developed. These include;

- i. ALDERSGATE/ Hymns of our Faith on 27<sup>th</sup> May, 2023 at Asawase Circuit.
- ii. Diocesan Junior Choir Conference on  $20^{th} 22^{nd}$  October, 2023 at Abuakwa Circuit.

### 15.0 - BEREAVEMENT

During the period under review, we reported the demise of our brother Bismark Oheneba Gyabaa (1<sup>st</sup> Deputy Director of Music) Santasi circuit who was a chorister at St. James Methodist Church, Atasemanso. The Diocesan Music Directorate and the administration joined the Santasi circuit choir during the Candle light programme and the burial. May the good Lord grant him eternal rest.

### 16.0 - CHALLENGES

- \* Music workshops at the Diocesan and Circuit levels are not encouraging. This is because most circuit directors, deputies, Choirmasters and Organist do not avail themselves for these developmental sessions.
- \* Lack of commitment or apathy of some members towards the Choir.
- \* Clash of programs with other sister organizations especially singing Band, which affects our attendance and our finances.
- \* Dwindling in terms of membership of most Choirs due to transfers, postings, resettlement, Inter- church and Inter- organizational competitions etc.
- \* Inadequate incentives to motivate most Choirmasters and Directors.

#### 17.0 - RECOMMENDATIONS

- \* To continue organizing workshops (Zonal base) and seminars for our Circuit Directors, Deputies, Choirmasters and Organists to raise their standard in terms of Choir directing and management.
- \* To continue and extend our visitations (by involving other circuit Directors) to the less distressed and outside metro circuits to help revive them.

- \* To also plan and take the Diocesan Choir on exchange programme with our brothers and sisters from the Northern Accra Diocese.
- \* To use the Diocesan Choir for evangelism through Radio, Television and other social media platforms.
- \* To present a very strong and vibrant Diocesan Choir for Tarkwa 2024 Connexional conference.
- \* To stage another Oratorio (Creation) concert in Accra or Sunyani by the end of 2023.
- \* To start preparations towards another Oratorio concert come 2024.
- \* To ensure smooth transition process of the Kumasi Diocese and the In-coming Kumasi North Diocese.

### 18.0 - CONCLUSION

As the Church and the Association continues to grow, we are challenged as to how to intensify education and training program to get more musicians and technical men to sustain the work in the Diocese and our respective societies. I will humbly plead with Conference to make a resolution to the church on how to revamp the human resource from the society level to the Diocesan level else, the Diocese will struggle to get competent musicians to sustain what our predecessors started in few years ahead.

The Diocesan Music Directorate took office with deep sense of humility and purpose. The team has, thankfully, enjoyed tremendous support from the clergy, officers (past and current), past Diocesan Directors of Music, some Circuit Directors and a host of veterans, who together has made us achieve some modest successes. Finally, we are grateful to the Almighty God for his strength, protection, wisdom, guidance and how far He has brought us.
